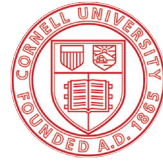


What is New York Sea Grant?

Research, Extension & Education with Impact

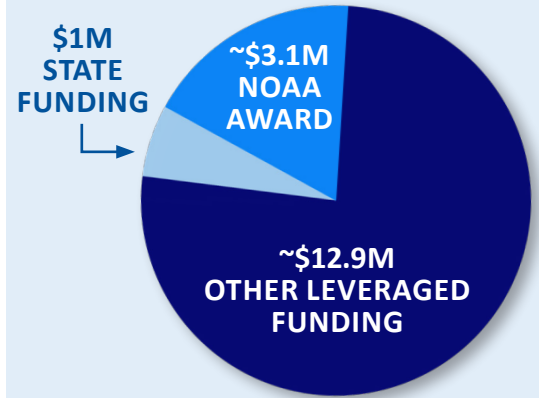
NYSG uses input from coastal communities and researchers to advance state-of-the-art research and coastal management for the benefit of New York's varied coastal environments and communities.

NYSG is a federal/state matching funds program.



Since 1971, NYSG managed a portfolio of **\$222.4M** for research and extension

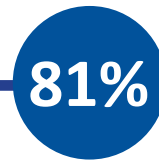
